24	VIOLATING THE SGA CONSTITUTION, BY-LAWS, OR UAM STUDENT HANDBOOK,				
25	OR ANY OTHER RULES OF THE UNIVERSITY MAY ON UNANIMOUS VOTE OF THE				
26	ETHICS COMMITTEE AND MAJORITY VOTE OF THE SENATE BE SUSPENDED				
27	AND/OR EXPELLED FROM THE UAM SGA SENATE BODY."

29	B. IF A COMPLAINT IS MADE AGAINST A MEMBER UNDER ARTICLE X SECTION A				
30	OF SENATE BY-LAWS, IT MUST BE ADDRESSED TO THE SENATE ETHICS				
31	COMMITTEE, SPECIFYING THE PARTICULAR ACT COMPLAINED OF TOGETHER				
32	WITH ALL THE DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE BEARING ON THE CASE, AND A LIST				
33	OF NAMES OF WITNESSES WHOM HE/SHE MAY DESIRE TO EXAMINED ON SAID				
34	COMPLAINT. THE CHAIRMAN OF THE ETHICS COMMITTEE SHALL CAUSE COPIES				
35	TO BE SERVED ON THE MEMBER COMPLAINED OF; AND IT SHALL BE THE DUTY
